His entire life had been turned upside-down and he didn't understand why, but his world, and mine, were about to change. Felix came into my home as a hospice foster through June's. My thought was, I'd nurse him back to health and let him enjoy his remaining months in peace and comfort. I felt I was doing him a favor by helping him have a happy ending. I didn't realize then, but it was actually Felix who would be doing me the favor.

It's been over a year now and Felix is thriving in my home. He enjoys sunbathing, snuggling, chasing toys, and bossing the dogs around (cats rule, dogs drool after all). He is full of character and charm, and he is anything but "old". He uses his superhero strength and determination to overcome lifethreatening obstacles including: a tooth abscess, surgery to remove rotten teeth, severe arthritis in his back, and kidney disease. He refuses to let anything keep him from living life on his terms. He simply isn't done living, and no one, vet or otherwise, will tell him when he's done.

Over the last year Felix has become one of my greatest teachers. He has taught me to live in the moment, like soaking up the morning sun, and to enjoy the small things, like chasing but-terflies. He has taught me to never to give up, no matter how big the

obstacle or how bad the odds. But most importantly, he has taught me to love deeply and completely, as only someone with superhuman strength can. Through this journey, I've realized that a little bit of faith can take one further than they ever imagined. Felix is now 20 years old, and continues to prove to the world that determination, love, and faith can truly move mountains, as well as save lives.

I am incredibly grateful to June's for allowing me the chance to experience the wonderful lessons that are best taught by our furry friends. The newly created Felix Legacy Fund will extend far beyond Felix's living years. It will benefit many senior cats and humans alike. He is nothing short of a living legend: a true superhero.
